

TOP TRAY

Competition Rules

1. The Top Tray class is for a collection of three types of vegetables taken from the following list of eight. The quantity of each vegetable required for the collection is given in brackets: Carrots (3), Cauliflowers (2), Onions (3), Parsnips (3), Peas (6 pods), Potatoes (3), Runner Beans (6 pods), Tomatoes (6). Each type of vegetable will be judged out of a total of 20 points. This is split into three sections as follows: 7 points for size, shape and colour; 7 points for condition; 6 points for uniformity. The overall mark will therefore be out of a total of 60.
2. All vegetables are to be displayed for effect. The vegetables must be displayed within an area measuring 45cm by 60 cm (18x 24in), without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray. A tray or board measuring 45cm by 60 cm (18x24in) can be used to display the vegetables, or the area can simply be marked on the staging. Where a tray has a lip or edge, it is the internal measurements that must not exceed 45cm by 60cm (18x24in).
3. A black cloth is permitted, and the tray may be painted. Parsley is allowed for garnishing but no other foliage or accessories, such as plates, sand, rings etc will be allowed. Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia or string.
4. The winner of the Top Tray class will receive a certificate plus a £10 voucher. The runner-up will receive a £5 voucher. The third place will receive a £3 voucher. These vouchers can be redeemed in the allotment shop before the end of 2010.

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS AND JUDGES

- Carrots and parsnips must have foliage trimmed back to 7.5cm (3in).
- Peas and Beans must be displayed with some stalk attached.
- Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces (the green flower bud case).
- Judges may handle exhibits, open pods etc to check for quality.
- The tray, board or staging must not be cut or mutilated in any way at all - such as cutting holes for standing onions in.
- Judges should use their discretion when judging the Top Tray class, remembering that entries may come from inexperienced exhibitors.
- The points awarded should be clearly marked by the judges on each exhibitor's card.
- Any queries that may arise, regarding anything other than the above rules, should be referred to, and decided by, the show officials.

Failure to abide by any of the above rules will lead to disqualification.

Rules for Exhibitors

1. Classes are open to members of Eastney & Milton Allotment Holders Association only, except the junior classes where children/grandchildren (under the age of 14) of members may enter.
2. There is no entry fee for staging exhibits.
3. Entries shall be in one name only (as membership) and no exhibitor shall make more than one entry in any one class.
4. All exhibits in classes 1-43 must have been grown on Eastney Lake / Milton Piece / Hope Cottage Allotment sites. All other exhibits may be home grown/made and must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least two months prior to the show.
5. Entries shall be made on the entry forms provided or on a copy thereof, and handed into the Trading Hut no later than the Tuesday prior to the show.
6. Management and judges reserve the right to refuse or disqualify any entry without giving their reasons.
7. Judging will be in accordance with RHS Show Handbook (copy in the Trading Hut) except classes 1-14, 43-64.
8. Points will be awarded in all classes as follows; First - 3points, Second - 2 points, Third - 1 point.
9. Exhibitors cards will be available from the Show Secretary at the time of staging exhibits and must be placed **face down** on or alongside the exhibit. At the time of judging, exhibits with no card will be deemed as 'Not for Competition'.
10. All plates / containers / vases shall be provided by the exhibitor.
11. Where known, horticultural exhibits should be correctly named.
12. The show site will be open for staging exhibits from 0900-1045 hrs on the day of the show. Exhibitors passes will be provided on arrival and will be valid until 1045 hrs only.
13. No exhibit shall be removed from the show benches before 1600 hrs. Any exhibit remaining after 1630 hrs will be deemed to be a donation to the Association and disposed of at the management's discretion.
14. In each class, rosettes will be awarded to First, Second and Third place winners. However, only one rosette per placing per exhibitor will be presented - irrespective of the number of class placings an exhibitor achieves. A certificate recording the placings achieved will also be awarded.
15. All trophies, rosettes and certificates will be awarded at the Harvest Supper (tickets available from the Trading Hut and at the show).
16. Whilst every effort will be made to avoid damage / loss to exhibits, the Association accepts no liability for same under any circumstances.

TOP VASE

Competition Rules

1. The Top Vase class is for a vase of mixed flowering stems containing a total of between five and ten stems, taken from a minimum of two different kinds of plants. Please note that it is two different KINDS of plants, two varieties of the same plant are NOT two kinds.
2. The display will be judged out of a total of 35 points, split into: 25 points for the colour, form, condition, quality and freshness of the flowers on display and 10 points for the overall presentation and effect of the flowers in the vase. The vase will be viewed from all directions. Judging of the flowers should be to the normal rules used for other classes.
3. Stems used in the display must be showing flowers only; no seed heads or berries will be allowed. The vase can be any shape and size and made from any material, but must be in proportion to the display. No marks are awarded for the vase itself.
4. No accessories such as bows and additional foliage will be allowed. Foliage which is growing naturally from the flowering stem and is still attached to that stem, is allowed.
5. Packing material - including Oasis - to keep the stems in place is allowed.
6. The winner of the Top Vase class will receive a certificate plus a £10 voucher. The runner-up will receive a £5 voucher. Third place will receive a £3 voucher. These vouchers can be redeemed in the allotment shop before the end of 2010.

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS AND JUDGES

- Flowering stems can be taken from ANY flowering plant.
- The different kinds of plants need to be taken from different genera. For instance, pinks, carnations and sweet william - which are all dianthus - would not be classed as different kinds.
- Only fresh, home-grown flowers can be used in the vase. No dried or silk flowers are allowed.
- A vase, by definition, is any vessel that can be used to hold cut flowers and which is taller than it is wide at its widest point.
- The Top Vase class is open for anyone to enter and is not intended purely for growers who regularly display single species classes at shows.
- Judges should use their discretion when judging the Top Vase class, bearing in mind that the entries may come from inexperienced exhibitors.
- Judges and exhibitors should note that the display has to be viewed all round.
- The points awarded should be clearly marked by the judges on each exhibitor's card.
- Any queries that may arise, regarding anything other than the above rules, should be referred to, and decided by, the show officials.

Failure to abide by the rules will lead to disqualification.
